



Education Requirements

Dental Assistant

Many dental assistants are trained on the job, although most choose to enroll in a dental assisting program. Many states require that a prospective registered dental assistant graduate from a program accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation.

Dental Hygienist

An associate's degree is the typical level of education for these professionals; a state license also is required.

Dentist, General

Once students graduate from dental school, they must be licensed.

Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeon

Oral and maxillofacial surgeon's complete dental school, a general surgery internship for one year, and then complete an additional three years of specialized training.

Prosthodontist

After obtaining a Doctor of Dentistry degree, completing a residency in prosthodontic dentistry to specialize in this area is required.

- take and develop X-rays
- sharpen and sterilize dental equipment

- provide routine procedures such as filling cavities, cleaning and repairing teeth
- may perform surgeries within or around the mouth to promote dental health, improve appearance and prevent disease
